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Short reflections for Advent

The Prologue to John's Gospel is unlike any other part of the New Testament. In just a few verses it contains the mystery of the incarnation—how God became human. The same verses outline the fulfilment of all God's plans for his creation and provide the foundation for Christian hope.

In these short Advent reflections, one for every day between 1 December and Christmas Eve, we trace a journey through this extraordinary piece of writing. As you read and reflect on the words, let them call forth wonder and worship of the God revealed in his Son Jesus.

Gracious God, speak again, so I may hear afresh what things both great and small you wish me to hear.

THE BEGINNING was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not understood it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light, he came only as a witness to the light.

The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognise him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of

God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father full of grace and truth.

(John testified concerning him. He cried out, saying, 'This is the one I spoke about when I said, "He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me."') Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in the closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.
